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# Civic Engagement Active Learning Activity 3

#### DESCRIPTION

Students in AFAM 200 or another course devoted to the promotion of civic engagement will work in groups of five students per team to develop their own activity or endeavor devoted to civic engagement. Student groups will devote at least ten hours of service during the semester after the development of this civic engagement activity. At the conclusion of participation in this civic engagement activity developed by their group, students will give a formal presentation to the class on their respective experiences.

#### LEARNING OUTCOMES

- 1. Students will learn from their involvement in their developed civic engagement activity the source and function of values associated with a healthy democracy.
- 2. Students will compare the values, norms, and ideals of freedom associated with activities and events grounded in civic engagement.
- 3. Students will develop an understanding of the importance of values, ethics, and social responsibility for the self and for contemporary society related to events or activities anchored in civic engagement.
- 4. Students will reflect on how values shape personal and community ethics and decision-making as they relate to civic engagement.
- 5. Students will relate issues surrounding values, ethics, and responsibility to their own capacities to address ethical and social challenges.
